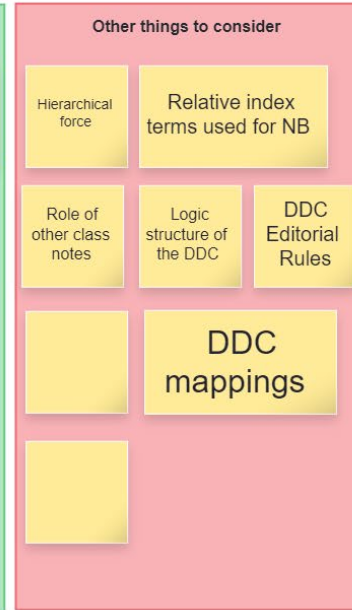
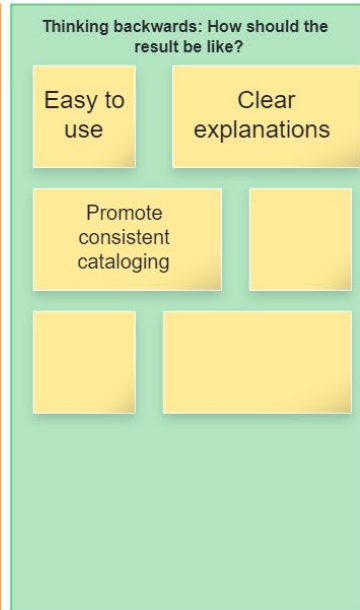
What can EDUG do?

- Look at the problem from different perspectives
 - Librarian, classifier/cataloger, Dewey translator, Dewey teacher, etc.
 - Close collaboration with the Dewey editor and the EPC
 - Experience in DDC mapping

Goal:

A recommendation paper that will be submitted to Alex and the EPC for further discussion and final decision.

...and reservations

- Long-established local solutions and workflows might not be easy to adapt to a change
- Keep the added value provided by DDC mappings
- Keep a Dewey number's inner structure for topics to reflect their level of congruency with the number

How could a change look like (hypothetically)?

1. Abolish only the rule that prohibits adding to standing room topics
2. Keeping the rule while reviewing all information about the rule and provide information where missing
3. Develop further exceptions to the rule
4. Review the meaning and descriptions of the notes and related concepts, and modernize them for more clarity and simplicity

Next steps & tasks (A)

Task A

- Draft a content structure of the paper (Table of content)
- Start writing the first parts: background, history
- Who: Core writing team (Alex, Terrance, Harriet, Tina)
- When: First meeting soon

Next steps & tasks (B)

Task B

- Develop What-if scenarios

→ Who: All of us!

→ When: Over the nexts months, sent to the Writing team

Next steps & tasks (C)

Task C

- Analyses and statistical statements:
 - Editorial & translation-related issues (Class-here notes, Including notes, Hierarchical force, Captions, Relative Index, types of topics in Including notes, etc.)
 - built numbers, facets
 - mappings

→ Who: Alex, Terrance + Translation group

→ When: Next translation group meetings or extra meetings

Next steps & tasks (D)

Task D

- Exceptions to the rule & Special use cases & Mappings
 - Who: Alex, Terrance (Exceptions to the rule existing today)
 - Who else: Those who practice a special approach (DNB, BnF, Norwegian team, etc.)
 - When: Over the next months, sent to the Writing team

Next steps & tasks (E)

Task E

- List places where definitions and explanations about Approximate the whole can be found today
 - What kind of information do we need in the future? And where do we want to find it?
- Who: Writing team
- Who else: All of us!
- When: Over the nexts months, sent to the Writing team

Next steps & tasks (F)

Task F

- Pilot project: Pick areas for live testing and analyze impacts
 - Who: Alex, Terrance + Translation group
 - When: To be analyzed and developed over the year taking into account the input received for the other tasks

Time target

- Send out a first draft of the paper to all members by beginning of 2025
- EDUG meeting 2025: Either have a final version or a draft version to be approved at the meeting
