



- Foresee trends
- Comprehensive overview of UK publishing
- Insight into the use of Dewey in libraries
- Cater for the needs of different types of institution
- Exposed to both pre-publication information and the published item
- Counter a theoretical approach with a pragmatic view based on literary warrant



How Do We Promote Dewey?

- Encourage libraries to embrace new edition
- Advise libraries on the implications of change
- Advise libraries swiftly on the creation of new numbers



How Do We Support Dewey?

- Representation on the Dewey Committee
- Provide feedback from our customers
- Identify potential for phoenix schedules, discontinuing numbers or conflict
- Advocate the benefits of classification versus categorisation
- Universal availability of numbers leads to standardisation and secures the future of the classification code
