International Projects (1)

High-Level Thesaurus Project (HILT)

- Subject interoperability project—Dewey used as spine for switching among terminology sets
- Plans underway to test a distributed Dewey web service based at OCLC

World Digital Library

- Dewey as standard scheme applied to all records
- October 2007 prototype will include DDC
 Summaries in seven project languages +
 historical periods of India



International Projects (3)

Representation of DDC in MARC 21 Formats

- Dewey editors, DNB, LC, and OCLC
- Initially, DNB proposed changes to Bibliographic Format, while Dewey editors focused on Classification and Authority Formats

Early Translation Models

- Focus on local needs of language group vs. interoperability
- Focus on production of print edition
- No standard format for data representation



Transition to Current Environment

- Development of guidelines in mid-1990s
- Development of XML schema and translation support software
- Print and web versions
- Focus on localization <u>and</u> interoperability



Localization

Coverage and representation of topics match the literary warrant needs in the language group



Interoperability

Translation contains categories that are compatible with the English-language standard edition and other translations to foster the use of Dewey as a multilingual switching language



Localization and Interoperability

- Examples
- Terminology in captions, notes, index
- Built numbers
- Consistency in meaning of categories
- Implementation of standard options
- Interoperable expansions



Consistency in Meaning of Categories

English-language edition:

South China Sea (in note at T2-164 in A14)

Vietnamese-language edition:

East Sea (in note at T2—164 in A14)



Options (1)

For standard/optional numbers that are completely reversed:

222.86 *Tobit (Tobias)

(Optional number in standard edition; Tobit classed in 229.22 in standard edition)

229(.22) Tobit (Tobias)

(Preferred number in standard edition, but optional number in Italian edition; Tobit classed in 222.86 in Italian edition)



Options (2)

For standard/optional treatment within numbers:

222.9 *Esther

Class here deuterocanonical part of Esther

(Optional treatment in standard edition; deuterocanonical part of Esther classed in 229.27 in standard edition)

229(.27) *Deuterocanonical part of Ester

(Preferred number in standard edition, but optional number in Italian edition; deuterocanonical part of Esther classed in 222.9 in Italian edition)

Content and Viewpoint

- Updates to language, literature, geography, history, peoples
- Corrections across the DDC
- Selected topics of interest/expertise, e.g.,
 Canon law, bowling, fountains
- Advice on social issues, e.g., domestic partnerships, abortion



Time for a New Transition?

- Content and viewpoint
- Representation
- Relationships
- Structure



Content and Viewpoint

- Reconsider captions at all levels based on expanded needs, e.g., browsing, web services
- Approach "universality" of developments from a critical theory stance
- Identify areas for global transformation
- Map Dewey to new view, not new view to Dewey

Representation

Can we use the MARC 21 Classification and Authority Formats as the basis for representing the DDC authority file?



MARC 21 Proposal

- Provision of edition and source
- Identification of notation in Tables 1-6 and in internal add tables
- Identification of standard/optional numbers and primary/access numbers
- Specification of Dewey numbers and component parts
- Links to upward hierarchy

Representation: Issues for Further Study

- Can we derive other representations of Dewey data from MARC 21, e.g., XML, SKOS?
- Can we derive ontological representations of the DDC to facilitate machine application?



Relationships

- Relationships of some topics (index entries, mapped headings) lack explicit standing room or equals/approximates-the-whole labeling
- Can we exploit the rich network of relationships for query expansion?
- Are additional relationships needed?



Rethinking Structure

- General interest in flexible structures with contractions/expansions
- Interest in vernacular/English versions mixing abridged and full editions
- Translations of abridged nearly always expanded in targeted areas
- Current process of intellectual logical abridgment costly



Questions

- Can we develop a set of rules to derive the abridged edition from the full edition with reduced intellectual involvement?
- Can we develop a model for mixed translations?



Proposed Guidelines: Abridged Classes

- All captions will be the same as those found in the full edition
- All including/class-here/classelsewhere/see/see-also references will be included at the same level of notation



Proposed Guidelines: Additions to Abridged Classes

- Inclusion of subordinate categories will be handled by an 80/20 automatic process (e.g., subordinate classes listed as number/caption pairs without notes, captions added to machine-generated including note)
- Class-elsewhere and see-references that reference numbers in other hierarchies will be included (with abridged numbers); see-also references will be skipped

Standard subdivisions are added for skiing and snowboarding together, for skiing alone

796.932 Cross-country skiing

Including biathlon

Class here Nordic combination, Nordic skiing

For jumping, see 796.933

796.933 Jumping

796.935 Alpine skiing (Downhill skiing)

Class here downhill, giant slalom, supergiant slalom racing

796.937 Freestyle skiing

Including ballet, mogul, trick skiing

796.939 Snowboarding

796.93 Skiing and snowboarding

Standard subdivisions are added for skiing and snowboarding together, for skiing alone

Including jumping

796.939 Snowboarding



Automatic Abridged Records (1)

Approach 1:

796.93 Skiing and snowboarding

Standard subdivisions are added for skiing and snowboarding together, for skiing alone

Including cross-country skiing, jumping, alpine skiing (downhill skiing), freestyle skiing

796.939 Snowboarding

[Including note under 796.93 automatically generated from captions in subdivisions of 796.93]



Automatic Abridged Records (2)

Approach 2:

796.93 Skiing and snowboarding

Standard subdivisions are added for skiing and snowboarding together, for skiing alone

796.932 Cross-country skiing

796.933 Jumping

796.935 Alpine skiing (Downhill skiing)

796.937 Freestyle skiing

796.939 Snowboarding

Proposed Guidelines: Indexing

The electronic abridged index will include all topics in full edition, with abridged numbers derived from segmentation



Abridged Edition: Issues for Further Study

- Add tables and add instructions
- Tables 1-6
- Options
- Manual notes
- Introduction and Glossary
- Print index



Mixed Translations

- Translate classes to abridged level plus include additional classes with high literary warrant
- Add classes from English-language edition at lower levels



Mixed Translation Example (German/English)

Mixed Translations: Issues for Further Study

- Language of standard terminology (e.g., Class here, Hier auch)
- References to topics in vernacular and English
- Add tables and add instructions
- Tables 1-6
- Options
- Manual notes
- Introduction and Glossary
- Multiple indexes



International Collaboration: Sharing Data

- Access to interoperable expansions
- Access to virtual extensions, i.e., built numbers
- Access to mappings
- Access to bibliographic records and metadata
